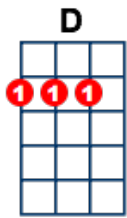
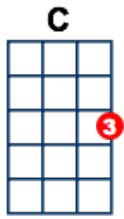
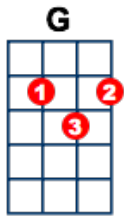


In the Middle of the House
